PURPOSE

- ◆ To get feedback from the HEHS Committee.
- ◆ To obtain a recommendation from the HEHS Committee regarding presentation to the full City Council for vote.
- ◆ To present a proposed ordinance providing a process for submission, review and processing of applications for an ordinance supporting a Municipal Setting Designation (MSD).

BACKGROUND

- ◆ Staff has briefed the Health, Environment and Human Services Committee several times regarding state legislation on the establishment of Municipal Setting Designations (MSD)
- ◆ Two pilot projects were undertaken by the City of Dallas and the Texas Commission for Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in 2004.
 - These resulted in the first two MSDs granted by the State of Texas.
 - The Statute requires:
 - ◆ City Ordinance Restricting Groundwater; or
 - ◆ City Resolution Supporting Restrictive Covenant
 - Staff believes use of ordinances is the better format.

ONE KEY ISSUE

Whether to:

- ◆ Require the applicant to delineate the entire plume as part of their application

Or

- ◆ Include only that portion of the plume which is on the property

RECOMMENDED OPTION

- ◆ If the Designated MSD Property does not contain the entire plume of contaminated groundwater, require a statement certified by a Professional Engineer, to the effect that passage of the ordinance and granting of the MSD by the state will not:
 - Result in, cause or contribute to endangerment or health or the environment; or
 - Result in, create or contribute to any health or safety hazard.
