

# **DFE Projects Overview**

- USACE ["Corps"] has received confirmation of federal funding for the following projects in the amount of \$7M:
  - Repair erosion and make improvements to the channel at 1-45 and Trinity River near Lower Chain of Wetlands
  - Complete construction of joint-use maintenance roads/trails in the DFE
- City is required to cost share in the amount of approximately \$6.08M and will need to provide this match in August

### **DFE Projects Overview**



# Sources of Funding for City's Match

- The following sources have been identified:
  - \$2.08M from Stormwater Funds
  - \$275K from 2012 Bond Program (Runyon Creek)
  - \$748K from 2003 Bond Program
  - \$2.577M from 1998 Bond Program (Requires redirecting funding from the Elm Fork)
    - Staff and Council will continue to work towards future projects and funding for Elm Fork Flood Control and Recreation
  - \$400K from Trinity Trust

## **Proposed Schedule of Actions**

- Corps will be bidding and finalizing contracts for construction activities related to these actions between now and end of August
- Prior to execution of contracts, Corps will require receipt of funds from the City
- Construction activities could begin as early as September/October provided project areas are not inundated by overbanking of the Trinity River

# **Requested City Council Action**

 Confirm funding sources for the City's required match and recommend City Council Agenda Item in August

 Direct staff to continue to work towards future projects and funding for Elm Fork Flood Control and Recreation
