This item is was placed on the addendum to allow for immediate waste disposal and decontamination services.

This action will authorize service contracts for hazardous and non-hazardous waste disposal and bio-hazardous decontamination and spill clean-up services for the City.

## **BACKGROUND (Continued)**

These contracts will be used for the disposal of confiscated, biologically hazardous, environmentally hazardous and non-hazardous materials such as:

- Blood
- Body fluids
- Corrosive/flammable materials
- Liquor, beer and wine
- Ammunition and fireworks
- Automobile and equipment solid batteries

Also included in these contracts is the collection and disposing of used and spilled cleaning materials, paints and pesticides to avoid City employee exposure to such materials and to ensure compliance with the Environmental Management Program. These products need to be disposed in accordance with specifications for toxic hazardous substances separately from the City's regular solid waste pickup and materials recycling. The recommended vendors meet the wage floor rate of \$10.37 approved by City Council on November 10, 2015, by Resolution No. 15-2141.

On February 26, 2014, City Council authorized Supplemental Agreement No. 3 to increase the service contract for hazardous and non-hazardous material clean-up and disposal services for City departments to extend the contract term through December 18, 2014, by Resolution No. 14-0370.

#### **BACKGROUND**

This item was scheduled for the Council consent agenda but is being placed on the addendum since the Park and Recreation Board deferred the item on April 7, 2016 to the next Park and Recreation Board meeting on April 21, 2016, in order to allow staff to produce additional information. Placing the item on the addendum will allow the Park and Recreation Department to pull the item if it is not approved by Park and Recreation Board on April 21, 2016. The TIF Board requires that the construction requirements of the agreement be completed by the end of June, hence a delay in Council approval will make it impossible to meet this deadline.

This action will authorize a development, operation, and maintenance agreement with Dallas Hartford, L.L.C. (Dallas Hartford) for the renovation, operation, and maintenance of Federal Plaza located at 1900 Federal Street.

On March 26, 2014, Resolutions Nos. 14-0526 and 14-0527, approved a development agreement with and expenditure of TIF funds for Dallas Hartford, such funds being supportive of redevelopment of the City Center TIF District. In addition to a minimum private investment of \$5,000,000 in the redevelopment of the 400 North St Paul Street Hartford Building, an Urban Design Peer Review Panel (UDPRP), appointed by the City Manager, required Dallas Hartford to:

- a. Include the adjacent park (Federal Plaza) in the project scope.
- b. Create linkages between the park and the renovated building through selection of materials, lighting, landscaping, and a shade structure.

#### **BACKGROUND** (Continued)

c. Consider the potential impact of the future trolley alignment on design of the park and the public area adjacent to the building.

Such recommendations by UDPRP, and expenditure of TIF funds, are consistent with TIF Project requirements for development and redevelopment for improvement to a space for public benefit, such as City parks, open space, trails, or cultural facilities.

The agreement with the Park Board will be subject to the following terms:

- 1. The term is for 20 years.
- Dallas Hartford, at its own cost, is responsible for the development of the design, plans, and specifications for the improvements to be made to the park (Exhibit B attached to the resolution). Dallas Hartford will submit the design to the Park and Recreation Department for review and approval prior to commencement of construction.
- 3. Dallas Hartford, at their own cost, is responsible for the operation, maintenance, and repair of the park during the term of the agreement.
- 4. Dallas Hartford will manage the design and construction through its own consultants and contractors and will be responsible for all permits and other approvals. All consultants and contractors are required to provide insurance that is consistent with what is required by City consultants and contractors.
- The City of Dallas will retain the right to require Dallas Hartford to modify the improvements if and when necessary to maintain public safety of the parkland.

#### PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On March 26, 2014, Council authorized a development agreement with Dallas Hartford to reimburse eligible project costs, by Resolution No. 14-0526.

On March 26, 2014, Council authorized reimbursement to Dallas Hartford from TIF funds, by Resolution No. 14-0527.

The Park and Recreation Board deferred this item on April 7, 2016.

The Park and Recreation Board approved this item on April 21, 2016.

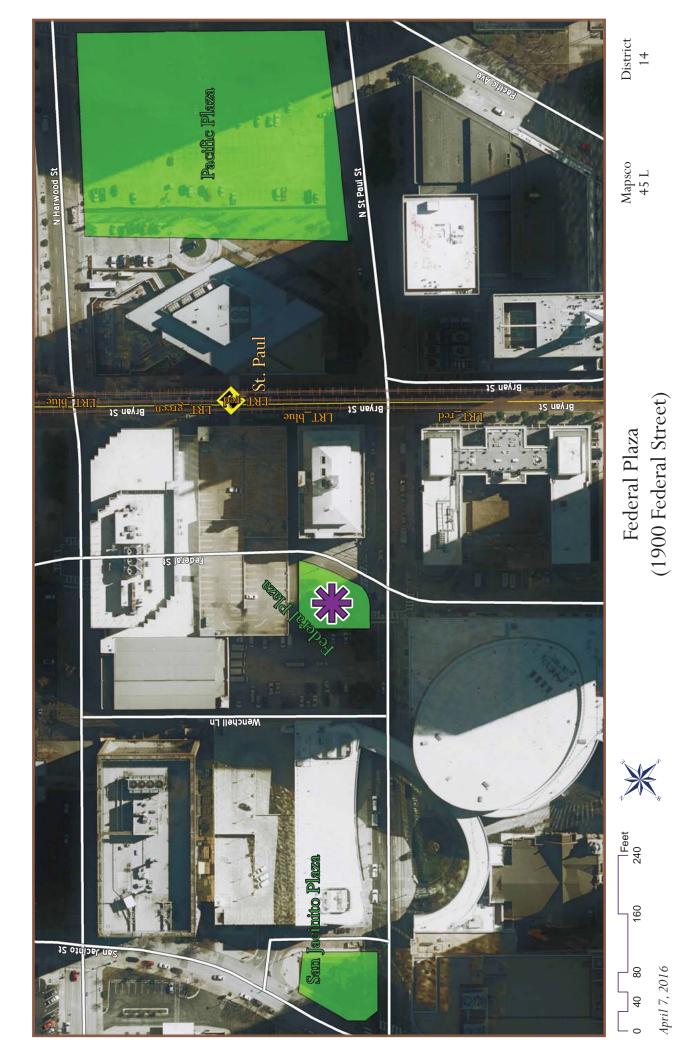

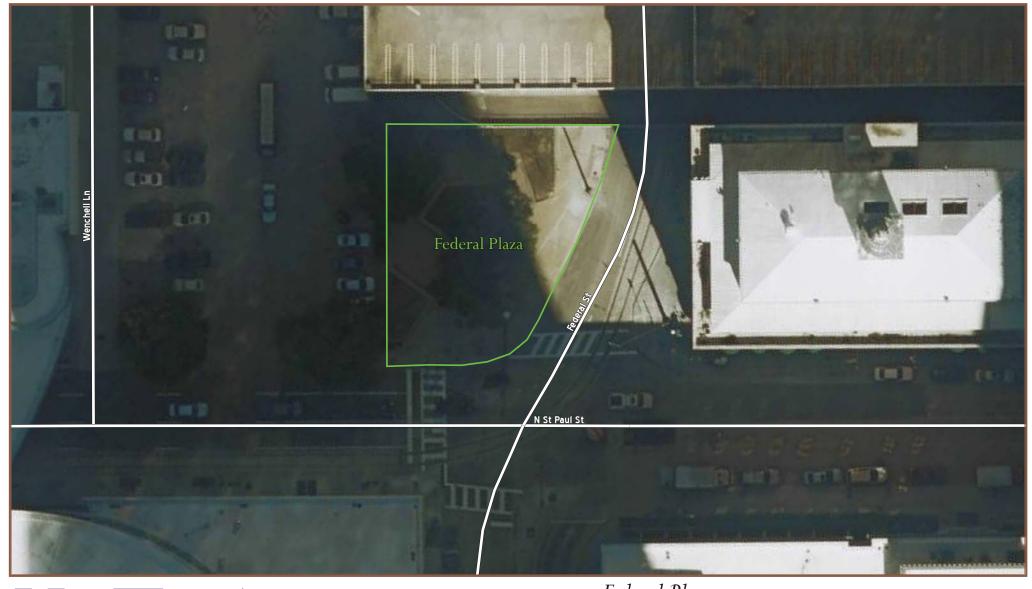

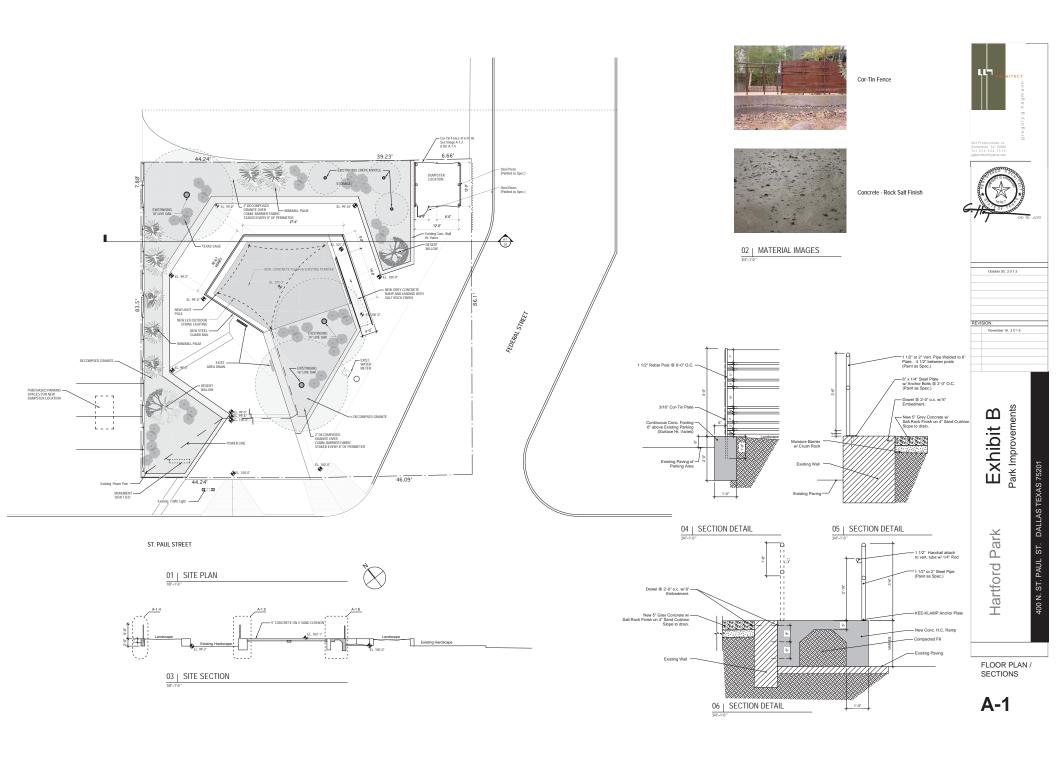

## **BACKGROUND**

This item was placed on the addendum due to the late award notification and the requirement that City Council approve it before funds can be issued to this grant for enforcement period April 28, 2016 through June 6, 2016.

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) issued an award notification to the Dallas Police Department on April 12, 2016. This award has been granted for April 28, 2016 through June 6, 2016. TxDOT requires approval from City Council for acceptance of this grant award before funds can be issued for this program. The Click It or Ticket Grant provides for the reimbursement of overtime salaries paid to officers enforcing Seatbelt and Child Safety Seat laws at locations throughout the City of Dallas.

This grant is one of the "wave" grants from TxDOT that are part of the national traffic safety plan and are awarded to TxDOT grant recipients. The grant is for the increased enforcement of Seatbelt and Child Safety Seat laws during the national campaign of April 28, 2016 through June 6, 2016 (enforcement period).

## PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (Council, Boards, Commissions)

Authorized an application for and acceptance of the "Click It or Ticket" Mobilization grant from the Texas Department of Transportation for a safety belt initiative on April 22, 2009, by Resolution No. 09-1072.

The (3) month extension of the agreement with Xerox State and Local Solutions, Inc. will continue the existing services for operation of the parking system including: citations management and delinquent collections, meter and parking lot maintenance, meter collections, and customer service for a fixed monthly fee of \$267,379.33 for 3 months of services to be paid from gross revenues collected.

The (3) month extension will provide sufficient time to finalize the close of the current procurement process and transition to new service providers.

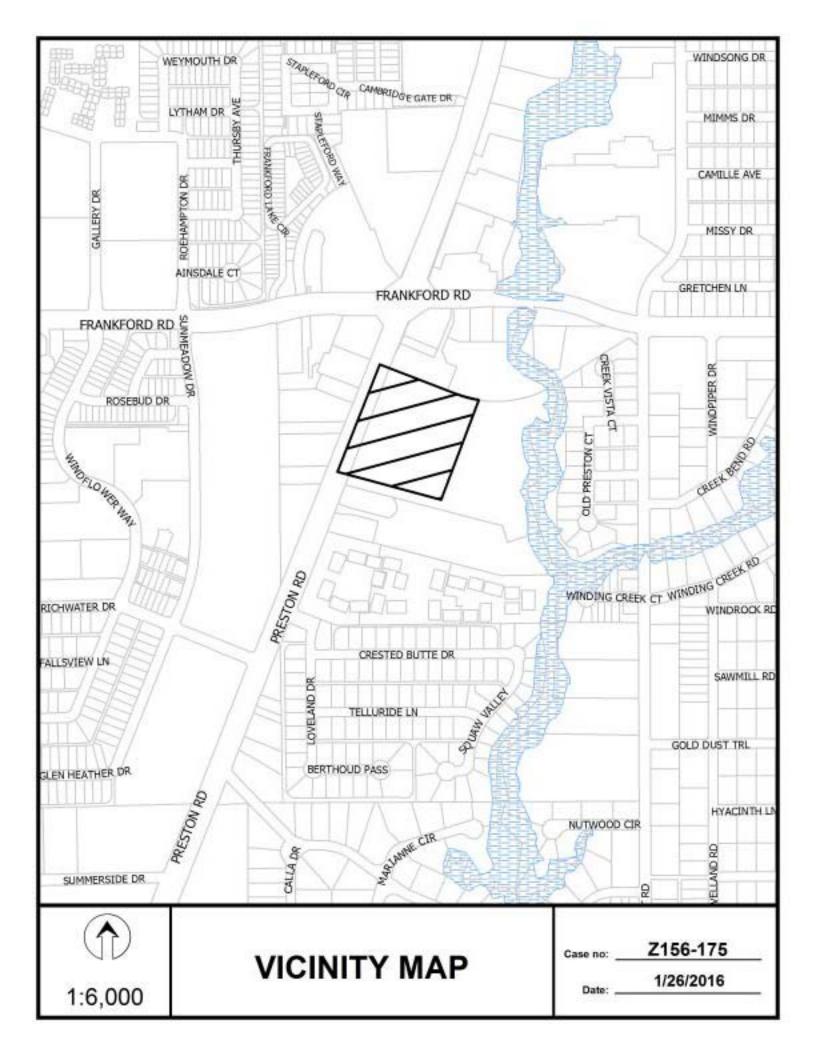

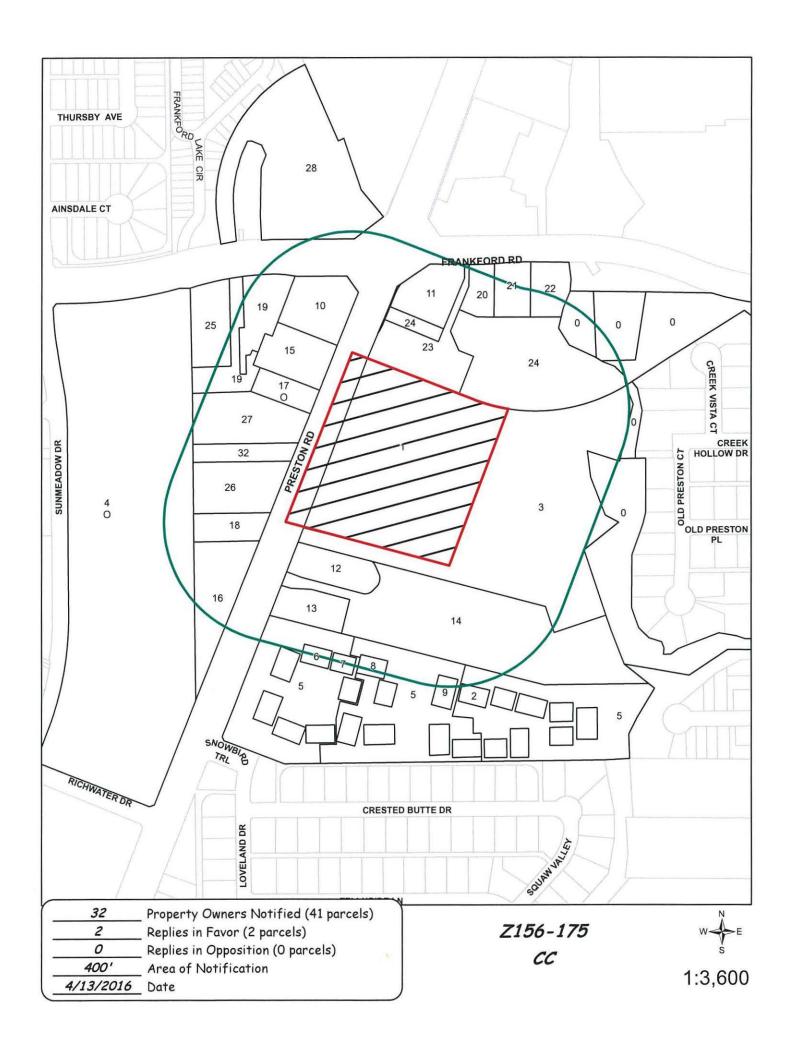

A resolution ordering Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC to show cause regarding the reasonableness of its existing Transmission and Distribution rates within the City of Dallas - Financing: No cost consideration to the City

### **BACKGROUND**

This item was placed on the addendum and is moved forward by Council direction.

The City is a regulatory authority under the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA) and has original jurisdiction over the rates of Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC (Oncor). Pursuant to section 33.021, 36.003 and 36.151 of PURA the City may on its own motion or on a complaint by an affected person, initiate a proceeding to determine whether the existing rates of a public utility are unreasonable or in any way in violation of any provision of law. Upon such a finding of unreasonableness, the City may determine just and reasonable rates.

The City has reason to believe that Oncor is over earning and that its rates are excessive. The Executive Committee of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor, of which Dallas is a member, is recommending that all member cities initiate show cause proceedings against Oncor. The Steering Committee has agreed to retain consultants at their expense to assist the City in its review of Oncor's rates; however, the City reserves its right to seek reimbursement from Oncor.

### PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (Council, Boards, Commissions)

On April 20, 2016 this item was briefed to City Council.

### FISCAL INFORMATION

No cost consideration to the City.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dallas is a regulatory authority within the meaning of the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA), which also vests the City as a regulatory authority with original jurisdiction over the rates of Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC (Oncor) to determine if such rates are just and reasonable; and

**WHEREAS**, Sections 33.021, 36.003 and 36.151 of PURA empower a regulatory authority, on its own motion or on a complaint by any affected person, to determine whether the existing rates of any public utility for any service are unreasonable or in any way in violation of any provision of law, and upon such determination, to determine the just and reasonable rates; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dallas has reason to believe that Oncor is over earning and that its rates exceed those which are just and reasonable; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dallas is a member of the Steering Committee of Cities Served By Oncor; and

**WHEREAS**, the Executive Committee of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor has recommended that cities pass a resolution that requires Oncor to show cause why its transmission and distribution rates should not be reduced; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dallas, and the City Council of the City of Dallas desires, on its own motion, to exercise its authority under Sections 33.021, 36.003 and 36.151 of PURA; and

WHEREAS, a procedural schedule should be established for the filing of certain information by Oncor, procedures to be followed to obtain and review information from Oncor, the filing of an analysis of such information by the City, the filing of rebuttal information from Oncor, and a public hearing at which time the City shall make a determination whether the existing rates of Oncor are unreasonable or unjust, including whether they are in any way in violation of any provision of law, and if such rates should be revised and just and reasonable rates determined for Oncor.

Now, Therefore,

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

**SECTION 1.** That this resolution constitutes notice of the City's intent to proceed with an inquiry into the transmission and distribution rates charged by Oncor. On or before September 1, 2016, Oncor shall file with the City of Dallas, information that demonstrates good cause for showing that Oncor's transmission and distribution rates should not be reduced. Specifically, Oncor shall file with the City of Dallas information for the test year beginning January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2015, regarding Oncor's cost of service elements, including, but not limited to the elements detailed by the Public Utility Commission as necessary for the filing of a Statement of Intent to Change Rates. The test year may be updated for more current data and shall be adjusted for known and measurable changes.

**SECTION 2**. That the City's designated representatives shall have the right to obtain additional information from Oncor through the filing of written requests for information, to each of which Oncor shall respond in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days from the receipt of each such request for information.

**SECTION 3**. That the City's designated representative shall file his or her analysis of Oncor's filing and information on or before October 13, 2016. Such analysis may include or refer to any analysis or report by any consultant retained by the City in connection with work necessitated by this resolution.

**SECTION 4**. That Oncor shall file any rebuttal to the analysis of City's representative on or before November 10, 2016. With its rebuttal, Oncor may present whatever additional information it desires to defend its current rates.

**SECTION 5.** That the City Council will be briefed on Oncor's rate filing at its regular scheduled meeting on December 7, 2016. After the briefing by staff, a representative of Oncor and a representative of the City of Dallas' consultants will each be allowed to address the City Council and summarize previously filed reports for no more than 15 minutes.

**SECTION 6**. That a public hearing shall be conducted by the City Council for the City of Dallas on December 14, 2016, during the regular council meeting scheduled to commence no earlier than 1 p.m. Based upon such hearing, the briefing of staff, and the consultants' findings, a determination of the reasonableness of the existing rates of Oncor shall be made by the City Council and, if necessary, just and reasonable rates shall be determined to be thereafter observed and enforced for all services of Oncor within the City of Dallas, Texas.

**SECTION 7**. That the City Council may, from time to time, amend this procedural schedule and enter additional orders as may be necessary in the public interest and to enforce the provisions hereof.

**SECTION 8**. That subject to the right to terminate employment at any time, the City of Dallas hereby ratifies the Steering Committee's selection of Geoffrey Gay with the law firm of Lloyd, Gosselink, Blevins, Rochelle & Townsend as legal counsel to assist the City of Dallas in its ratemaking and to prosecute any appeals to the Texas Public Utility Commission or court. The Executive Committee of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor shall retain appropriate consultants to prepare a report and make rate recommendations.

**SECTION 9**. That fees and expenses of attorneys and consultants assisting the City in the Steering Committee's review of the reasonableness of Oncor's rates will be processed through the Steering Committee but the City reserves the right to seek reimbursement from Oncor pursuant to the PURA Section 33.023.

**SECTION 10**. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this resolution was passed was open to the public as required by law, and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given all as required by Section 551.041, Texas Government Code.

**SECTION 11.** That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so resolved.

### **SUBJECT**

### **BACKGROUND**

This item authorizes the quitclaim of 96 properties that were foreclosed by the Sheriff's Department for unpaid taxes pursuant to judgments or seizure warrants from a District Court and the release of liens for any non-tax liens that may have been filed by the City and were included in the foreclosure judgment. These properties are being sold to the highest bidders and will return to the tax rolls upon conveyance.

Successful bidders are required to sign a certification stating that they are not purchasing these properties on behalf of the foreclosed owners and that they have no debts owed to the City, no pending code violations, and are not chronic code violators.

All properties were reviewed by the Housing Department for infill housing and were not desired for that program.

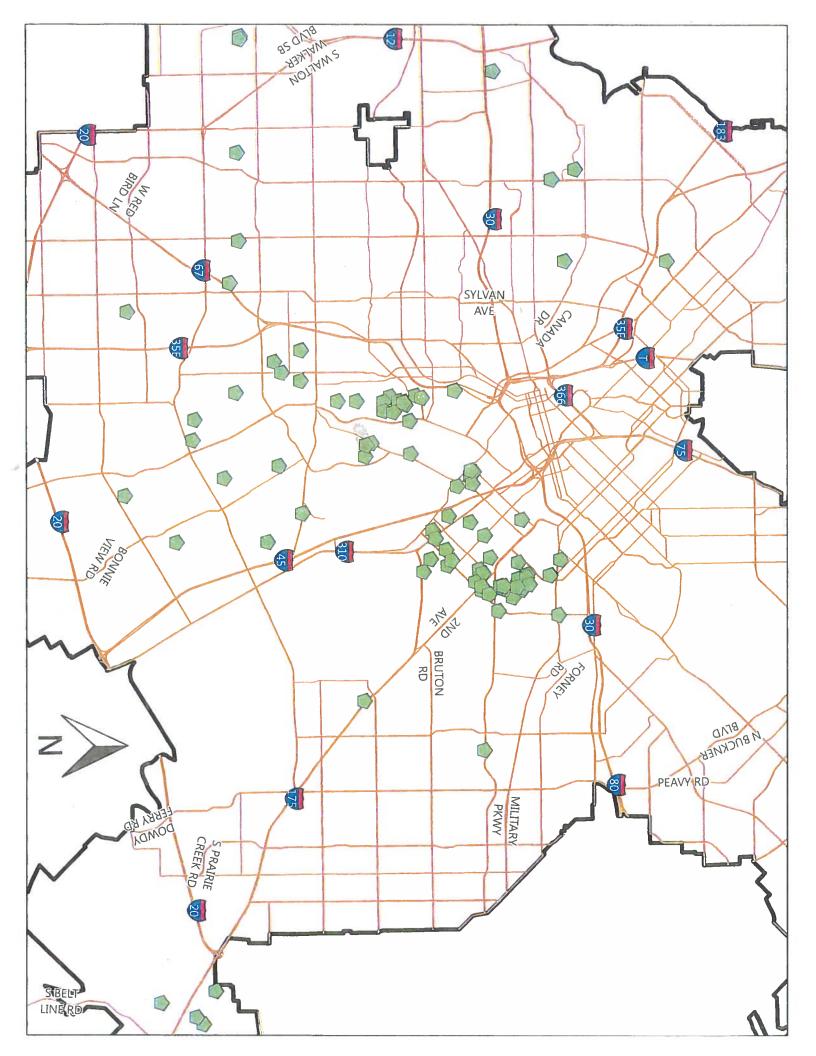

WHEREAS, the City of Dallas ("City"), the State of Texas ("State"), the County of Dallas, ("County"), and/or Dallas Independent School District ("DISD") acquired Sheriff Deeds to properties ("Properties") at a sheriff tax sale ("the First Sale") authorized by a Judicial Foreclosure ("Judgment") in a District Court in Dallas County, Texas. The Sheriff's Deeds were recorded in the real property records of Dallas County, Texas as described on "Exhibit A," attached herein and incorporated by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Texas Attorney General Opinion No. JM-1232 and Section 34.05(a) of the Texas Property Tax Code, the City may re-sell the Properties ("the Second Sale") subject to any right of redemption existing at the time of the Second Sale; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 34, Section 34.05 of the Texas Property Tax Code, a taxing entity is authorized to re-sell the Properties ("the Second Sale"); and

**WHEREAS**, by accepting its pro rata proceeds from the Second Sale, the State agrees to the transfer of Properties in which it has an interest; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager, acting on behalf of the County pursuant to a County Commissioner's Court Order, and acting on behalf of DISD pursuant to a School Board Resolution have the authority to execute Quitclaim Deeds to the purchasers of Properties at the Second Sale, and transfer any rights, title, or interests acquired or held by each taxing entity that was a party to the Judgment at the First Sale; and

**WHEREAS**, the Properties were advertised in the Dallas Morning News on the dates indicated on Exhibit A; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council has previously approved the re-sale of other Properties where funds were not received, nor disbursed prior to the April 1, 2001 Tax Collection Consolidation with Dallas County; and

**WHEREAS**, the distribution of the proceeds from the resale of the Properties will be in accordance with Chapter 34, Section 34.06 of the Texas Property Tax Code; **Now**, **Therefore**,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

- **SECTION 1.** That upon receipt of the monetary consideration from the purchasers of the Properties listed on Exhibit A, and upon consent by the County and DISD, the City Manager upon approval as to form by the City Attorney and attested by the City Secretary, is hereby authorized to execute Quitclaim Deeds to the Properties, conveying to the purchasers the right, title, and interest acquired or held by each taxing entity that was a party to the Judgment, subject to any right of redemption, post-Judgment taxes and post Judgment non-municipal liens, and in accordance with the written agreement of the terms, conditions, and release of the taxing entities.
- **SECTION 2.** That the consideration received from the Second Sale shall be distributed pursuant to Chapter 34, Section 34.06 of the Texas Property Tax Code, and applied to the payment of the court costs, interest, and cost of sale and applied to the amount of delinquent taxes, penalties, and non-tax municipal liens as set forth in the Judgment and pursuant to the order of the court.
- **SECTION 3.** That all purchasers shall be responsible for the pro rata portion of property taxes for the remaining part of the current calendar year that will be assessed from the date of closing of the Second Sale. Purchasers shall also be responsible for any post-Judgment taxes, penalties and interest, pursuant to the Texas Property Tax Code, and post-Judgment non-municipal liens. The Properties shall be replaced on the tax rolls as of the date of execution of Quitclaim Deeds.
- **SECTION 4.** That to the extent authorized by law, any liens securing taxes referenced in Section 2 above are hereby released. That the City Manager, upon approval as to form by the City Attorney, is authorized to execute a release(s) of lien for any non-tax municipal lien(s) which (i) are included in the Judgments issued in the foreclosure suits filed by the City on the lot(s) shown on Exhibit "A"; or (ii) arise or are filed of record post Judgment and prior to the Second Sale by the City on the lot(s) shown on Exhibit "A".
- **SECTION 5.** That any and all proceeds from the Second Sale, including funds not received, nor disbursed prior to the April 1, 2001 Tax Collection Consolidation with Dallas County will be deposited to General Fund 0001, Department DEV, Balance Sheet Account 0519.
- **SECTION 6.** That upon receipt of the consideration from the Second Sale, the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to disburse the proceeds in accordance with Chapter 34, Section 34.06 of the Texas Property Tax Code. Calculations for disbursements shall be provided by the Director of Sustainable Development and Construction to the City of Dallas Land Based Receivables, the Dallas County District Clerk, and the Dallas County Tax Office from the account specified in Section 5, above.
- **SECTION 7.** That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so resolved.
