

- deliberating security assessments or deployments relating to information resources technology, network security information, or the deployment or specific occasions for implementations of security personnel, critical infrastructure, or security devices. [Tex. Govt. Code §551.089]

SUBJECT Recommendations for Administrative Law Judge Positions

On July 24th, the Judicial Nominating Commission, as required by City Ordinance and pursuant to proper notice, convened into session and interviewed candidates for the Administrative Law Judges of the City of Dallas.

For reference, The Judicial Nominating Commission (Commission) serves as an advisory body to the City Council in matters related to: the filling of municipal judge vacancies the reappointment of current municipal judges, salary recommendations for municipal judges. the implementation of a merit evaluation system for the appointment and reappointment of municipal judges, the filling of administrative law judges, salary recommendations for administrative law judges, recommendations for improvements in Court and Detention Services.

Administrative Law Judges (ALJ) hear demotion or discharge appeals for eligible City employees pursuant to Section 34-40 of the Dallas Personnel Rules.

- Under contract for two years;
- Compensated \$400 per hearing day;
- · Must be a licensed attorney who has practiced law in the State of Texas for at least three years or a person who has at least five years of experience adjudicating hearings of personnel decisions;
- · Not have been an employee or an elected or appointed officer of the City, other than a full-time or associate municipal judge, within the five years immediately preceding application:
