Tethering Background

- Proposed changes to original ordinance presented to Animal Advisory Commission 4/27/2017
 - Allow tethering 24/7
 - Must have adequate shelter and potable water
 - Must not be in standing water
 - Tether must be connect to a collar/harness, and tether cannot be a chain
 - Unobstructed range of motion and unlikely to become entangled and cause injury



Tethering Background, cont.

- Current city ordinance allows tethering with restrictions
 - Ordinance is unenforceable due to time restrictions
 - Defense to prosecution makes prosecution difficult
- Animal Advisory Commission on April 27, 2017, voted to move forward with proposed changes

Tethering Background, cont.

- Presented to Quality Of Life May 22, 2017
 - Voted not to move forward with recommendations
 - Requested further input from citizens
 - 2 Committees created
 - Citizen committee
 - AAC subcommittee
 - Requested tethering census



Tethering Background, cont.

- Census BID request sent out by City
 - Sent out 2 times on June 28 and July 14
 - City contacted specific groups to see if interested
 - 7/21/2017 solicitation closed with no response



DAS Recommendation

- Current DAS Recommendation
 - No tethering
 - Exception: allow tethering in presence of owner
 - Simplify current ordinance
 - Remove defense to prosecution



DAS Recommendation, cont.

- Current DAS Recommendation
 - Education campaign to inform the public of tethering ordinance update
 - Allow for an education period minimum of 90 days, but not to exceed 6 months to allow enforcement on a case by case basis at the discretion of a DAS Field Supervisor

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
