Economic Development

- ICDC received approval by Council on 5/24/17 for a \$131,231 grant from the Public/Private Partnership Fund and a \$131,231 loan from SDFPTF for improvements to Grand Plaza Shopping Center at 3101 Al Lipscomb Way.
- On September 14, 2017, City Council approved an ordinance approving and adopting the final 2018 Service Plan, the final 2017 Assessment Plan and the 2017 Assessment Roll for the South Dallas/Fair Park PID.
- With council approval in May 2017, The South Dallas Fair Park Opportunity Fund provided \$100,000 as an economic development grant to the Dallas Foundation, the fiscal agent for Bonton Farms, for the Bonton Market. Construction is currently on-going.
- The Market is a \$370,000 project, with the remaining funds provided through charitable donations. The market is expected to hire 7-10 employees at completion (4 FTE) and will include a neighborhood market, a café serving breakfast and lunch, and health and wellness programming.








D7 VS. CITYWIDE SRS June 2017 – January 2019





District 7 Risk Information

4600 S. Malcolm X Blvd. "Little World Convenience Store": This case was opened by the Community Prosecution/RISK team due to ongoing violent crime, as well as documented gang and drug activity. The property consists of a 24-hour convenience store and a commercial strip. Following a meeting with the CP/RISK team, the property owner hired security, installed barricades at driveways preventing access to the parking lots during late hours when all other businesses are closed, installed and monitored surveillance cameras, improved exterior lighting, removed all of the items associated with drug sales and use, and complied with the convenience store ordinance.

9595 Scyene Road "Ariba Food Mart": This case was opened by the Community Prosecution/ RISK team after numerous reports/arrests of open air drug sales. The property consists of a 24-hours convenience store. Following several meetings with the CP/RISK team, the business owner partnered with neighboring property owners to hire security, installed and monitored surveillance cameras, improved exterior lighting, removed all of the items associated with drug sales and use, removed gaming machines, and complied with the convenience store ordinance. Drug activity and violent crime has significantly reduced.

2639 Peabody Avenue: This case was opened by the Community Prosecution/RISK team after DPD's Narcotics Division completed an investigation and made several arrests at the single family rental property. Following a meeting with the CP/RISK team, the property owner vacated the property and began making significant repairs to the structure. The property was recently purchased by a new owner who continues to make significant repairs to the property.
