Activity	Description	Significant Aspects
Canton Street Facility	Traffic Field Operations (TFO) and Parking Enforcement operations make up the PWT Canton St. Facility. TFO installs and maintains traffic signals and traffic signs from this facility. Parking Enforcement provides enforcement of parking ordinances for the entire city from this facility. Activities include: Administration, Changing Tires, Chemical/Material Storage, Disposal of Waste Materials, Driving Off-Road, Driving On-Road, Equipment Storage, Fueling, On/Off Road Equipment Maintenance, Painting – Aerosol Cans, Pavement Repairs, Screen Printing, Spill Cleanup, Traffic Signal Repair and Maintenance, Welding/Soldering.	<i>Significant Aspects:</i>
Bryan Street Facility	The road striping operations provided by TFO operate from the Bryan Street Facility. This includes striping centerlines with large vehicle mounted units and striping smaller areas such as pedestrian crossings with smaller hand operated units. A thermoplastic resin is used for most applications; however, a solvent base paint is still used for a few specialized applications. Activities include: Changing Tires, Chemical/Material Storage, Driving On-Road, Equipment Storage, Fueling, On/Off Road Equipment Maintenance, Painting – Aerosol Cans, Spill Cleanup, Stripe Removal, Traffic Striping (machine), Traffic Striping (manual), Welding/Soldering.	<i>Significant Aspects:</i>
Waste Yard	The waste yard is operated by Storm Water Management. This is a 90-day facility used to accumulate hazardous and non-hazardous controlled waste prior to shipment to a disposal/recycle facility. The facility primarily accepts waste from accident scenes and waste generated from the clean up of spills. The facility also accepts a limited amount of waste from DFR, Sanitation, abandoned waste, and waste from other city departments that generate small amounts of regulated waste. Activities include: Chemical/Material Storage, Disposal of Waste Materials, Driving Off-Road, Driving On-Road, Fueling, Handling and Storage of Waste Materials, Spill Cleanup, Waste Transportation.	<i>Significant Aspects:</i>
Warehouse Yard	The warehouse yard is operated by TFO and is used as a storage facility for parts, equipment, and supplies required to install and maintain traffic signals and traffic signs. Because this is a warehouse facility, TFO does not staff this facility full time. TFO personnel travel to the facility on a set schedule and on an as needed basis. The facility is attached to a Sanitation Dept. transfer facility. TFO shares a portion of the facility with	<i>Significant Aspects:</i>

The OCMC facility also houses Storm Water Management (SWM), Construction Management, Environmental Management, Pavement Management, Facilities Planning & Construction, Engineering Services, Floodplain Management, and others.
