Sanitation Services host Fall Recycling Roundup

Residents can drop off items at four locations Citywide and get free movie passes

DALLAS - The City of Dallas Sanitation Services Department will hold their quarterly Recycling Roundup on Texas Recycles Day at four locations from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 15.

Residents can drop off recyclables at:

- Fretz Park Recreation Center, 6900 Beltline;
- Kiest Park, 3080 S. Hampton Road;
- Reverchon Park, 3505 Maple;
- Lake Highlands Elementary, 9501 Ferndale.

“The quarterly Recycling Roundups are part of our continuing efforts to protect the environment and make recycling easy,” said Director of Sanitation Services Mary Nix. “It also gives residents a chance to dispose of items that are not picked up during regular recycling days.” This year Dallas residents recycled 29,396 tons, increasing their recycling efforts from the previous years.

Sanitation staff members will be on hand with roll-off containers and trailers to accept televisions and electronic items (e-waste-video games, cell phones, computers, calculators); tires (limit three); scrap metal, small kitchen appliances; clothing, shoes and used books, glass, paper and plastic. Sensitive documents for shredding will be collected only at Lake Highlands Elementary (shredding is conducted at an off-site secured location). No household chemicals will be accepted. The first 75 participants with a valid ID, who drop off a minimum of 30lbs of materials, will receive a Cinemark movie pass. (One pass per family).
