Dallas Public Library series highlights greatest playwright of all time *Shakespeare Sundays will be held at the Central Library through December*

Dallas, TX – Shakespeare Sundays, a series of programs highlighting the works and universal appeal of William Shakespeare, will be presented at the Dallas Public Library, 1515 Young St. through December. All programs are free and begin at 2 p.m. in The Studio, third floor Humanities Division.

Here is the schedule of programs:

Sept. 23: *The Comedy of Errors*. Roger Daltry (The Who) stars in this BBC/Time Life production about two sets of twins separated at birth.

Sept. 30: *Much Ado About Nothing*. The BBC/Time-Life production of the tale of two hardly star-crossed lovers.

Oct. 14: *As You Like It*. Helen Mirren, Brian Stiner, and Richard Pasco star in the BBC/Time-Life production of one of Shakespeare's funniest plays.

Oct. 28: *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (abridged)*. The Reduced Shakespeare Company presents all 37 plays in 90 minutes in this Acorn Media production.

Nov. 11 and 18: *In Search of Shakespeare*. A two-part PBS presentation on the life, times and work of Shakespeare, filling in many of the missing parts of his story.

Dec. 2: *Twelfth Night*. The BBC/Time-Life Production of a classic tale of loss, disguises, mix-ups and ultimate happiness.
