## **Dallas Sanitation Services working to collect storm debris** *City posts online map showing progress, areas of next collection*

DALLAS, TX—The City of Dallas Sanitation Services department **continues to pick up brush debris** caused by the record snowfall that hit North Texas on February 11 and 12. As a result, regular bulk trash collection is running a week behind schedule. To help communicate with residents, the city has posted a “Storm Debris Chasers Map” online showing where brush and bulk collection has been completed and where crews will be working the next three days. The map will be updated every three days.

Sanitation Services assistant director Ron Smith says crews have collected over 10,000 tons of storm damage and expects to pick-up nearly 30,000 tons of brush by April 10, more than double the tonnage for a typical spring month. Because the storm damage is widespread and bulk collections are running behind schedule, the Sanitation department has posted an online map at [www.dallascityhall.com](http://www.dallascityhall.com) to show collection progress. Says Smith, “We’ve been through about half of the city’s neighborhoods and are hustling to get the rest collected. Our crews are working long hours and weekends to make sure that every neighborhood is served and that we get back on schedule as quickly as possible.”

For those who prefer to haul their brush away themselves, the city has designated two locations for brush drop-offs. By showing a drivers license with a Dallas address or a Dallas utility bill, residents can leave brush at:

Bulk trash (in trucks or trailers up to 15 ft or less) can be taken to any of the city’s transfer stations with proof of Dallas residency.
