Virgin of Guadalupe Lecture at The Latino Cultural Center

Carlos Antonio Rovelo, professor of Art Appreciation and Humanities at Eastfield College presents a lecture and visual narration on “La Virgen de Guadalupe Throughout the Ages” at the Latino Cultural Center on Saturday, December 9, 2006 at 2 p.m. In 1521, Tenochtitlan, the Aztec capital city and great military, economic and cultural empire was conquered by the Spanish crown. Less than a decade later, nine million indigenous peoples who had adhered to centuries-old cultural traditions embrace a new faith, The Virgen of Guadalupe. Professor Carlos Antonio Rovelo will explore what caused this cultural revolution and still today, impacts cultural traditions.
