Purpose of Briefing

Review City of Dallas transportation for hire regulation options

Different Transportation for Hire

- Limousines
- Taxicabs
- Services such as Uber, UberX, Lyft, Sidecar that say they are not taxicabs or limousines
- Other (Horse-drawn carriages, private ambulances, tow truck, pedicabs)

Issues/Concerns

Safety

- Qualified Drivers
 - Background checks for all drivers
- Suitable Vehicles
 - Vehicles inspected and properly equipped
- Appropriate insurance liability coverage for users
 - Operators submit policies documenting sufficient liability coverage

Quality

- All citizens have access to transportation for hire services
- Reasonable and consistent charges for transportation for hire services
- Assurance that customer service complaints will be addressed



What items do we want to regulate?

Consider four potential options

- Specific regulations for each service
- Universal regulations for all services
- Region-wide regulations involving multiple jurisdictions
- Combination of specific, universal and region-wide regulations



Specific regulations for each service

- Taxicabs
- Limousines
- Services such as Uber, UberX, Lyft, Sidecar that say they are not taxicabs or limousines
- Pros
 - All providers will operate under separate set of rules
 - Ensure public safety
 - Ensure accessibility
- Cons
 - Difficult to regulate

City of Houston

- Allows web enabled companies to operate as mobile dispatch of limousine services
 - Treats them as a limousine service
 - Need registration and provide contracted service providers
- Any company who offers limousine service shall obtain a permit
- Services need to be pre-arranged 30 minutes in advance
- Limousine services should charge a minimum of \$70.00 for two hours

City of Austin

- Allows web enabled companies (e-hail) to operate as a ground transportation service
- Any company who offers limousine service shall obtain a permit
- Ride sharing and car pooling services are exempt from obtaining a permit (no profit motive)
- Services need to be pre-arranged 30 minutes in advance
- Limousine services should charge a minimum of \$55.00 per hour

State of California

- Allows web enabled companies (Transportation Network Companies) to operate as a ground transportation service
- Transportation Network Companies (TNC) can offer limousine, sedan and ride share services with a permit
- Services need to be pre-arranged
- Vehicle safety and driver safety is verified by the TNCs and provided to the regulating authority

City of Washington D.C.

- Allows web enabled companies to operate as digital dispatch of transportation services
 - Required a business license from D.C.
 - Required registration with D.C. Taxicab Commission
- These companies can offer taxicab and sedan services
- Services need to be pre-arranged
